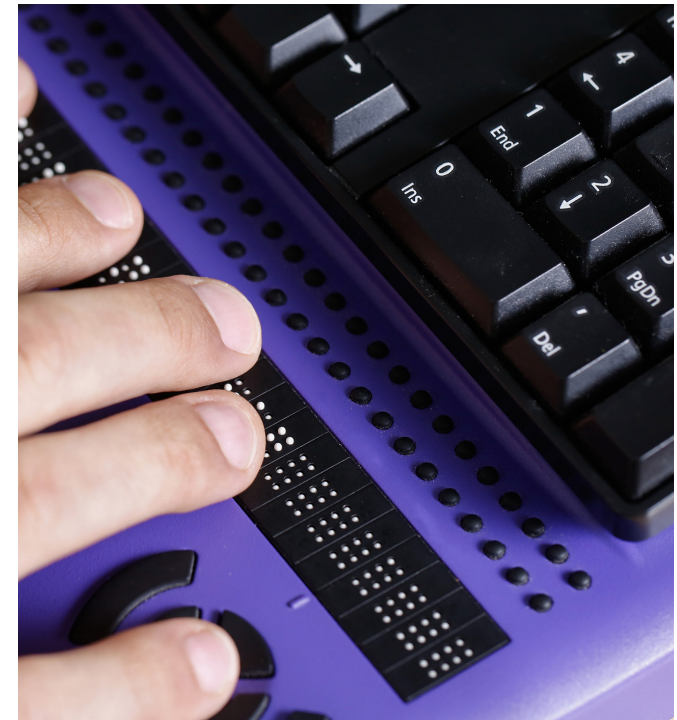

Assistive Technology (AT)



What is Assistive Technology (AT)?

Assistive Technology (AT) is specialized equipment and supplies that ensure a participant's health, welfare, and safety needs are met and enable a participant to increase, maintain, or improve their functional capacities.

Assistive Technology



Benefits of Assistive Technology

- Enhances independence and self-reliance.
- Improves communication and learning opportunities.
- Increase accessibility in workplaces, schools, and homes to assist with functions of mobility.
- Boosts confidence and quality of life.



Who can Benefit?

- **Individuals** with **physical, sensory, or cognitive** disabilities
- **Seniors** facing **mobility or health** challenges
- **Students** needing **learning support**

Accessing and Funding Assistive Technology

An assessment is completed and includes a review of disabling conditions, functional skills, and limitations.

- **Health care and Rehabilitation Centers:** Consult occupational, physical, or speech therapists for recommendations.
- **Schools:** Special education programs provide support for individuals ages 0-21 years old.

Types of Assistive Technology

1. Mobility Aids

- Wheelchairs (Manual and Powered)
- Walkers and Canes
- Stairlifts

2. Communication Aids

- Speech-generating devices (SGDs)
- Augmentative and Alternative Communication (AAC) tools
- Text-to-speech and voice recognition software

3. Hearing & Vision Aids

- Screen readers and magnification software
- Braille displays and note-takers

4. Learning & Cognitive Aids

- Text-to-speech software
- Adaptive keyboards and voice-controlled devices

5. Daily Living Aids

- Smart home automation (voice-activated lights, thermostats)
- Adaptive kitchen tools and utensils
- Medication reminders
